

We know that pursuing a graduate degree can be costly. We have a number of impactful opportunities available to help you secure financial support for your graduate studies at the Wayne State College of Nursing.

Nurse Faculty Loan Program*

The Nurse Faculty Loan Program (NFLP) was created to increase the number of qualified nursing faculty by providing loans to students enrolled in WSU's MSN or DNP programs. Upon graduation, 85% of the total NFLP loan is forgiven over a four-year period while loan recipients work in a full-time nursing faculty or approved preceptor role.

State funding for psych-mental health nurse practitioners*

The Wayne State College of Nursing was specifically selected by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services to lead efforts to increase the number of advanced practice psychiatric-mental health nurse practitioners in the state. Thanks to that support, incoming students have access to more than \$30,000 in financial aid to support their education.

Federal funding for psychiatric and family nurse practitioners*

A new Advanced Nursing Education Workforce Grant from the Health Resources and Services Administration provides \$25,000 annually to cover tuition and fees for Wayne State students who plan to become family nurse practitioners or psychiatric-mental health nurse practitioners and work in medically underserved communities.
