JACOB SCHOLARS PROGRAM OVERVIEW

1. Academic Preparedness

• Pre-Immersion Program, Intrusive Academic Advising, Faculty and Peer Mentor, Mandatory Group Study Hours and Supplemental Instruction, access to NCLEX preparation tools at end of program.

2. Financial Resources/Stability

• \$2000 annual stipend, completion package (stethoscopes, uniforms, lab coat, jacket, backpack).

3. Access to Role Models

• Mentorship program, monthly meetings with Faculty Mentor.

4. Campus & Community Engagement

• Social Activities, Campus Engagement, Volunteer Opportunities.



Program Requirements

- In collaboration with AHEC, Scholars attend Pre-Immersion Week (occurs one week prior to classes beginning in August).
- Monthly meetings with academic advisor.
- Participate in 2 hours of facilitated group study each week and individual tutoring twice per month.
- Participate in peer mentoring program.
- Attend at least 1 community outing per semester (bowling, picnic, volunteering).
- Attend one monthly WSU workshop/event.
- Must maintain the minimum GPA as outlined in the CON handbook and be in academic good standing with CON (75% or higher in each NUR course).



Must complete all surveys requested by the College of Nursing.

Program Success

- During the Fall 2023 semester, 23 (100%) upperclassmen (junior & seniors) supported by the Jacob Scholars Program continued to progress in the College of Nursing.
- By May 2024, 11 of the students who graduated from the program entered the nursing workforce.
- Of the graduates, 100% have passed NCLEX.
- Junior and Senior students have completed over 445 peer-facilitated study group hours.

OUTCOMES

- 2017 cohort: all students have completed NCLEX with a 100% first time pass rate.
- 2018 cohort: 9 of the 10 admitted students completed NCLEX. All test takers passed. One student who graduated in December 2023 is planning to take NCLEX February 2024.
- 2019 cohort: 10 of the 12 admitted students completed NCLEX. All test takers passed. The two students who did not take NCLEX withdrew/changed major prior to completing program.
